Born on 10 May 1960, at Ntigha, Abia State, Nigeria. Ordained Catholic Priest on 17 June, 1984, at Aba, Nigeria. Joined the diplomatic service of the Holy See (Vatican) on 1st July, 1994. Was elected Archbishop and appointed Apostolic Nuncio (Ambassador) on 12 November, 2012; was ordained Archbishop on 6 January 2013.
